Camden makes every effort to ensure children and families get a high quality service.

These are some of the activities and events children have been involved in over the past year:

# What have we been involved in since the last issue?

#### Children in Care Council (CiCC)

Young people who were involved in the Children in Care Council have been making decisions about things such as: developing employability skills workshop for graduate care leavers, updating the Camden Pledge and attending the Corporate Parenting Board meetings. At these meetings young people talk to councillors, the director of children's services and senior managers about how to improve services for young people in care and care leavers. They have also attended meetings

at Westminster with Edward Timpson, Children's Minister, and met children in care from different parts of the UK.



### Achievement celebration event for children in care

Children and young people's achievements are celebrated at the annual awards event which is always well attended by children and foster carers. The last event was at London Zoo followed by a visit to the Zoo. This year's event will also take place in London Zoo in October 2014.







## Disability Awareness training by young people

Young people from the Reactive Forum and from Young People for Inclusion have planned and delivered disability awareness training for Camden staff. The training was attended by 30 professionals from Camden Council and voluntary agencies and it was very successful.

#### Making decisions about services

Young people were involved in selecting the best people to be in charge of Camden services.

This included interviewing candidates for the job of director of children's services, the manager of the looked after children's health team and choosing the best Pathway services providers for young people over 16.

### Annual consultation about the children's social work service

Every year, we ask young people and parents to tell us about their experience of the children's social work service. Your views help to make the service for children and families better. Most young people said that having help from a social worker has made a positive change to their situation.

### Training social workers, managers and foster carers

Every year young people are involved in training social workers, foster carers and managers. The training programme is called **TOTAL RESPECT** – all about listening to children and young people. This is well attended training receiving excellent feedback.

The Young Inspectors scheme is a very successful programme of involving young people in inspecting services and making recommendations for change in services. Young people aged 16 to 19 inspect and report on the quality of children's social services in Camden.



# REPORT

This is a very effective way of reviewing the service as it is seen through the eyes of young people who themselves have experience of receiving support from the service. The last inspection in Summer 2013 focused on the **new MASH** service (Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub). The Young Inspectors interviewed managers of services and obtained feedback from teams about the service.

Their recommendations and messages are reported to senior managers and result in real changes and improvements to the service.




