What have we been involved in since the last issue?

Here are some of the things and events children and young people have been involved in since the last issue:

Making decisions about services

Choosing the best service to support children and young people is a very important task.

Last summer young people were involved in selecting the best agencies to provide a range of housing support services for care leavers and homeless young people and in selecting the best agency to support Camden young carers.

Celebration events for children in care

Children and young people's achievements are celebrated at the annual awards event which is always well attended. Care leavers help to host the event and to carry out consultations to get children's views about the event and to help plan future events.

The last event was at the British Library and everybody joined in

the Duck ride tour on the Thames.

This year's event is taking place in

October at the London Zoo.

Following the success of the last year's event, this has now become an annual consultation event for **birth children** of foster carers. Young people were involved in organising the consultation. Discussions and fun activities were arranged like ice skating and bowling.

Training social workers and managers

Young people delivered **TOTAL RESPECT training** to social workers, managers and foster carers. Young people decide what activities are included and lead the training. This is a very successful scheme, which is well attended and receives excellent feedback.

Children in Care Council (CiCC)



Over the past year, young people from the CiCC have been involved in: • the review of the LAC Academy and support with education for LAC • developing the BackChat online website • meeting with councillors at the scrutiny meeting and giving their views at the Children's Trust Partnership Board meeting. Representatives of the CiCC attended a meeting for LAC and care leavers with the Children's Minister at Westminster and took part in discussions about kinship care,



placements and the staying put scheme.

Councillor Angela Mason, Assistant Pirector Anne Turner, children and young people and foster carers attended the launch of the BackChat online website in March 2013.

The BackChat online website is for children, young people, carers and parents who receive services from Family Services and Social Work.

This includes looked after children and children with disabilities.

Young people from the CiCC were involved in every stage of the website development and made all decisions, from the initial concept to the final content. They also presented the website at the launch.

Young people have an active role in managing the website and are responsible for the young reporters link, the photo gallery, competitions, blogs and CiCC updates.
